CSA Updates

• EVP – Amy Caggiano – For School Advisory Committee two members are rolling off and positions need to be filled. There is a question regarding three members extending terms for continuity. Middle School principal will join the SAC once hired. Amy will send doodle poll so Board members may vote and candidates will be anonymous (as was done previously).

- Treasurer report Alyson Becker- We exceeded our expectations for this year. The CSA has \$26,000 in cash assets. Rolling CD into main account. Had a goal of spending \$39,000 and we're \$700 away from that goal. Curriculum Enrichment may go over. Spent the maximum on parent education.
- VP Elementary School Cary Keller spoke with Linda Vanaria about being a representative on the CSA Board and she was very enthusiastic we need to formally bring her in.
- VP Middle School Amy Versaggi, Chairs are in place for the Spaghetti Supper: Sarah Smith, Linda Tonies and Amy Versaggi. Graduation chairs will be put in place in the fall. Class reps and treasurers will de-brief to review how the year has gone. Shed has a few things that need to be tweaked. We need to buy a lock and there will be a move-in day.

- Book Fair Coordinator Report- Emily DiRocco Phyllis reported almost \$15,000 in sales. Our vendor says we are his largest book fair in the area. There were 80 children at PJ story time. 34% of sales occurred during the PJ story time. Carren Panico helped out with a lot during the week. Maya Bery bought \$900 of books. Usually we raise about \$4000 for the library. Thank you to everyone. It was very fun.
- Fundraising Husky Apparel need people to come at elementary pickup and sit there to help people order apparel. After school for the next 2 weeks at elementary pickup from 2:30-3:30. Has some inventory that will be sold off as well. Sale cut off is May 25th.
- Curriculum Enrichment report Amy Smack have had a great year; all grades touched by programs. Author and Colonial visit this week. All-school assembly coming up. Person talking about Arab culture. Will do K-4 and then grades 5-8 will be slightly different performance. Students will be engaged. Living Voices coming to 4th grade on June 3rd and 8th grade will do holocaust on June 1st. - Husky Directory Niressa Martin we have to wait for end of fiscal year to purchase My School
 Anywhere. Working on uploading data; program is very user-friendly. Want to work on advertisers.
 Give parents a coupon for different activity places for each month. Every parent needs to opt in or out
 for My School Anywhere. There is no deadline to opt in or out so we will try to get people to
 accomplish.

- School Supply Kits Shilpa Goel After a bit of delay people have started ordering. 170 kits have been ordered. There are 630 kids in the school. Running sale for 7 weeks. Had received feedback about some supplies were of inferior quality so they have been replaced. Staples may have a satisfaction guarantee. Elementary kids are not getting the boxes; brings down price by about \$5.

Some kids want to sign them so won't give away. Established media policy, Lawrence Cohen, Ph.D. spoke to parents, central lost and found created, held two evening meetings, hosted first summer camp fair, discovered \$16,000, moving Husky Handbook online (include CASE and preschool) altered school supply kits sale to less cardboard, added new elements to book fair, Red Sox night, involved in selecting a middle school principal, and changed our name. Christine Lear thanked everyone for all they have done. Christine & Alan Lear will make a contribution to the CSA in the name of all its volunteers. Christine made a seed bomb for everyone to take. Amy Caggiano thanked Christine Lear for all she has done and for involving so many people. It has been a great year!
